CTF Supports Fallen Workers

CTF helps injured and fallen transportation workers. Here are the stories of two.

Bobby Gill, 54 and an employee of Graniterock Company, was struck and killed by a dump truck. Bobby was part of a crew removing a mudslide on SR17 in February. A fifteen year employee, Bobby was a beloved member of Graniterock. CTF provided a Fallen Worker Grant to help his family and established the Gill Memorial Fund. Annette Brooks, 61, was shot and killed in April by an employee at the Caltrans maintenance facility in Humboldt County. The assailant then committed suicide.
