CTF Supports Injured Caltrans D6 Worker

On July 1, the Visalia Maintenance Superintendent, Arturo Saballa, was parked on the right shoulder of a multi-lane highway inspecting a guardrail repair. He was wearing personal protective equipment and had the flashing amber light on. Suddenly, a pick-up truck veered off the road, struck and pinched him between the vehicles, then threw him 40 feet away. Both Art's legs were broken in multiple places, as was his pelvis and nose, and he suffered a dislocated shoulder. He was airlifted to the local hospital and then airlifted again to Fresno Community Regional Medical Center.

He has endured multiple surgeries with more to come. He will also endure weeks in a rehab hospital. He is doing well, is expected to recover, and is eager to return to work.
